The Tapestry NT-NL Synodical Women's Organization SWO Fall Retreat Success

About 40 women gathered at Butman Methodist Camp outside of Merkel, TX the second weekend of October for mission, fellowship, and study. The bi-annual retreat was relaxing and rejuvenating. On Friday, women traveled from all over the Northern Texas-Northern Louisiana Synod to delve into the theme, "God's Undivided Neighborhood."



Pastor Leslie Dunlap welcomed everyone as they flattened and cut plastic grocery bags, hooked loops together to make plarn, and crocheted the plarn into 3'x6' mats for the homeless ministry of Abilene. The weekend work produced 14-15 mats.

Pastor Deb Loudin-McCann was our worship leader. She helped everyone loosen up drums and other rhythm instruments. She also shared about her ministry with homeless LGBTQ teens and young adults in the Deep Ellum area of Dallas. Pastor Deb also led the Bible study, challenging participants to define their neighborhoods, using I Corinthians 12:4-31 to define the gifts within unity and diversity, giving a fresh perspective on the parable of the good Samaritan.

Other speakers included Pastor Diane Eggemeyer from Miles speaking about their food bank and the diverse community with whom they get to interact and Pastor Irma Banales speaking about being intentional in mixing our synod events with the Latino

congregations. Pastor Irma and several women from various Latino congregations shared about their experiences with transitioning and bilingual congregations.

An in kind offering of personal care kits supplies were brought by attendants. After lunch on Saturday, gallon bags were filled with personal care items, snacks, and water. The Blessing bags were sent to Abilene to be distributed to the homeless.


